Region 9 Staff

The Region 9 Economic Development District of Southwest Colorado Inc. (Region 9 EDD) is a nonprofit, 501 (c) 6 public private partnership that promotes and coordinates economic development efforts throughout Southwest Colorado. Region 9 EDD includes five counties, ten municipalities, the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, and the Southern Ute Indian Tribe. Incorporated 34 years ago, Region 9 EDD has a Board of Directors with 17 representatives from local governmental jurisdictions and nine from the private sector.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- Facilitated monthly **SouthWEST Opioid Response District (SWORD)** meetings. Region 9 EDD received a completed feasibility study to identify the best options to fill existing treatment gaps.
- **Responded to 1,661 inquiries** covering business resources, grants, and data requests. This number decreased slightly from 1,786 in 2022. Inquiries were 1,760 in 2021 and 1,228 in 2020.
- Conducted a long needed audit of SCAN (Southwest Colorado Access Network) fiber.
- Received 1.55M in new funding including \$870K in CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) funding; \$500K
 Colorado Forest Service Loan Fund, \$36,458 SBA Microloan and Technical Assistance funds; \$41K for Rural Technical
 Assistance Program (RTAP) for High Alpine recreation geospatial study as pass through for the High Alpine Roadmap
 group; \$100K in Grant Navigator funds; and \$40K for CEDS implementation funds to assist with SWORD Coordinator
 position.
- Completed Carrier Neutral Location for broadband in the old Main Post Office building in downtown Durango.
- Received State approval for new Enterprise Zone boundary located in Durango's Mid-Town Urban Renewal District.
- Successfully **sponsored Higher Purpose Homes** as Rural Jumpstart Business.
- Received National Association of Development Organizations (NADO) Impact Award for integration of Southwest Colorado Council of Governments (SWCCOG).
- Made **49 presentations to community organizations** covering everything from Enterprise Zone, Grant readiness, rural economic development, businesses financing, and data.
- Assisted Town of Dove Creek with water reservoir project.
- Reestablished quarterly County/Town Administrator luncheons.
- Conducted quarterly Economic Development meetups for economic development professionals in the region.
- Provided **significant technical assistance around Prop 123** baseline data and educating communities and counties on impacts.
- Provided quarterly e-newsletter and monthly **Grant Digest**.
- Established Transit website (southwestrtc.com).
- Hosted weekly collaboration meetings for broadband stakeholders and housing stakeholders across the region.



REGION 9 PROGRAMS

Region 9 EDD integrated with the Southwest Colorado Council of Governments (SWCCOG) in 2022 and administers the **Southwest Transportation Planning Region**, **regional broadband**, and **transit initiatives**, as well as coordination around **regional housing initiatives**. Other activities include **business loans** and financing, producing the region's **Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy** (CEDS), **Grant Navigator services** and **data reports**, **Enterprise Zone Administration**, facilitating the **SouthWEST Opioid Response District** (SWORD), and other special projects. Region 9 EDD also serves as the fiscal agent for several additional programs.

GRANT NAVIGATOR

Region 9 EDD has received two years of funding to **connect organizations to federal funding** through our Southwest Colorado **Grant Navigator**. This position partners with governments and community organizations by providing a variety of grant services to build capacity and accomplish priority projects. In the past year, Region 9 EDD's community grant writer wrote and edited 22 grants, including nine for the Region, two for Archuleta County, one for Dolores County, six for La Plata County, two for Montezuma County, and two for San Juan County. Grant funds raised for the region total \$3.8M to date.


SWORD

Region 9 EDD facilitates the **SouthWEST Opioid Response District (SWORD)**, formed as a requirement of the Colorado Opioid Settlement Memorandum of Understanding, to **administer opioid funds in the region**. SWORD supported a feasibility study to explore viable options, and in November approved initial allocations of \$1.55M to four categories that will help to build a recovery ready region. SWORD has decided to invest the bulk of the funds towards building a recovery residence for individuals in recovery to live for 6 - 24 months.

ENTERPRISE ZONE

Region 9 EDD is the **Southwest Colorado Rural Enterprise Zone (EZ) Administrator** and determines if a business is located within EZ boundaries, processes EZ tax certification forms, administers the designation of EZ Contribution Projects, and certifies donations. Businesses in the EZ boundaries are eligible for a variety of tax credits. Currently, all of Montezuma, San Juan and Dolores Counties, and sections of La Plata and Archuleta Counties, are designated EZ areas. Archuleta, Montezuma, Dolores, and San Juan Counties have also been designated as Enhanced Rural Enterprise Zones (EREZ) through 2024.

Area businesses that participated in the Enterprise Zone Tax Credit Program in 2023 received \$556.2K in tax credits and documented \$18.5 million in qualified investments. This is a decrease from \$22.2 million in qualified investments and \$664,534 in tax credits in 2022. The number of businesses participating decreased from 279 in 2022 to 273.




In 2023 there were 26 designated Enterprise Zone Contribution Projects at the year-end. There were seven new projects added, six renewals, and five projects ended. **Projects generated \$1,157,097 in economic activity** through direct and in-kind contributions. This continues a declining trend when compared to 2022's 25 Projects at \$1.3M, 2021's \$1.46M; and 2020's 30 projects at \$2.35M. The decline was expected because the region lost active projects to the new Homeless Contribution Tax Credit and many of our approved projects are from smaller organizations.






Region 9 EDD provides commercial loans to businesses for gap financing and start-up needs. Loan funding supports businesses in creating and retaining jobs, leveraging other funds, or exporting goods or services. The Business Loan Fund (BLF) includes several Federal and State sources: Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) from the Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT) (contracted through La Plata County); the USDA Intermediary Re-lending (IRP) & Rural Micro Entrepreneur Assistance Program (RMAP); the Economic Development Administration (EDA); Start Up Loan Fund through OEDIT; Small Business Administration Microloan Program (SBA) and revolved funds from previously restricted funds that are re-distributed in the community.





Loan Disbursement by County: January 1 - December 31, 2023 Total = \$2,954,441











REGION 9 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Region 9 Economic Development District's assets continue to see an upward trend. Region 9 EDD is audited annually, and copies are available on request.





Since Region 9 EDD's loan program began over 30 years ago, \$42.43M has been distributed to businesses throughout the region. Region 9 EDD has 214 loans receivable as of Dec. 31, 2023, totaling \$11M, an increase from \$10.3M in 2022. Region 9 closed 34 loans creating 151 jobs compared to 49 loans creating 443 jobs in 2022 and 99 loans creating 82 jobs in 2021. There were 21 loans paid off this year, and 27 in 2022, with only three loans written off. Since December 2020, Region 9 EDD has made loans to businesses outside of our five counties through several statewide initiatives.
